

BOAT DOCKAGE RULES*

- 1. Fueling:** Absolutely no fueling of boats on the docks is permitted!
(Docks are being destroyed and water contaminated from fueling spillage.)
- 2. Hoses:** Hoses must be rolled up and put away after each use. Do not leave hose in boat or across sidewalk. Water must be turned completely off.
(New park hoses and hose racks have been installed and supplied one per two docks to be shared. ***These are Park Property and must be treated as Park Property.***)
- 3. Fishing tackle/buckets:** Do not leave anything on the docks or sidewalks like tackle, tackle boxes or buckets, etc.
(You are not the only one using the dock. You will be risking it blowing off or being stolen.)
- 4. Borrowing Slips:** Do not park your boat in another slip without permission from that renter and inform manager by written notice to be put in the slot at the office.
- 5. Trash:** Do not leave your trash beside basin nor in the garbage can in the laundry room. Take it to the dumpster!
(Boaters have been throwing fish guts and beer/soda cans by the bags full in the laundry room. This will not be tolerated.)
- 6. For those who use a dry storage space:** It is your responsibility to keep that space clean and mowed.
(Dry storage is a privilege that goes with wet slip when space is available. It will no longer be tolerated that your space is left overgrown and full of garbage, if you do not keep it clean, you will lose this privilege of dry storage and it will be given to someone willing to keep it clean.)
- 7. Fishing Cleaning Table & Ramp:** If you use the fishing cleaning table, you must clean up after yourself. Do not block ramp.
(The table has been left regularly full of fish guts and scales and bones. This causes a horrible odor and draws insects, maggots, and flies. Please take pride in where you live and keep it clean. *We don't want to have to remove the table.*)

****Renting a Boat Dock is a privilege and breaking any of these rules will result in loss of BOAT DOCKAGE PRIVILEGE.***
